>HAVING sent Moon Cresta back a number of times, I still can't get it to work. How can I use the Tandy program on the flip side?-SM

<I can't help with Moon Cresta. Anyone else had problems? With machine code, converting from Tandy to Dragon is a case of disassembling the program and subbing all JSR commands to ROM for the correct Dragon address. A program to convert Tandy Basic to Dragonese, and vice-versa, was published in the December, 1984 edition of Dragon User, available at 1.00 from Peaksoft. Harry adds: Basic programs on the Tandy Co-Co or Dragon, if saved in ASCII format, will load and run on the other machine, although you will have to manually change any keyboard peeks, as the values differ. A couple of years ago, Elkan were planning to introduce a machine code converter program, but I don't think anything came of it.

SNEAKY AD FROM HARRY

Anyone fancy one of those smart little Epson P-40 dot matrix thermal printers? (Dead quiet, so the missus doesn't know what you're up to if you want to dump a listing at midnight!)

It'll do large, condensed and emphasised, as well as dump graphics, and it purrs out the standard typeface at 45cps. 20 to 80 columns, depending on the type-face used.

As well as taking the genuine Epson roll paper, it will also use the Alphacom stuff, which you can pick up over the counter at any computer store.
